Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. The Atlantic District once owned a parcel of land on the Ring Road in Fredericton. What happened to that land?
- A. It was sold for \$61,500.00, with proceeds used to renovate the McGloin Street campus.
- Q. The Bible College once owned a Mens Residence on River Street in Fredericton. What happened to that building?
- A. It was sold for \$71,000.00, with proceeds used to renovate the McGloin Street campus.
- Q. Rev. Carroll McGruder raised pledges of \$160,000.00 one year at our Campmeeting. What happened to those funds?
- A. Only \$52,000.00 of these pledges ever came in; the funds were used for Camp operating expenses, road construction and mortgage payments.
- Q. Superintendent H.M. Lewis raised \$53,000.00 through "Gideon 300" and a Bike-A-Thon. What happened to those funds?
- A. This money was used to supplement the "My Gift" program to pay for renovations to the main building on McGloin Street.
- Q. What did it cost to renovate the main building on McGloin Street in 1994, and where did those funds come from?
- A. The total renovation costs were \$523,000.00, funded from the following sources:
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| Sale of property on Ring Road..... | 61,500.00 |
| Sale of former Men's Residence | 71,000.00 |
| Donation from District Ladies Department..... | 10,000.00 |
| Two Donations from UPCI Headquarters (\$10,000.00 USD each)..... | 27,500.00 |
| Gideon 300 fund and H.M. Lewis Bike-A-Thon..... | 53,000.00 |
| Bank Mortgage | 300,000.00 |
- Q. Where did the money come from to pay the principal and interest on this \$300,000.00 bank mortgage taken out in 1994?
- A. Basically, the \$300,000.00 mortgage principal and an additional \$38,000.00 in mortgage interest were paid through the generosity of "My Gift" participants just like you, who helped us pay off our five-year mortgage a whole year early!
- Q. What did it cost to convert the former chapel building to a Mens Residence in 1998, and where did those funds come from?
- A. The total renovation costs were \$50,000.00, funded from the following sources:

| Donation from Atlantic District account..... | 6,500.00 |
| Funds taken from NCC's normal operating budget..... | 32,000.00 |
- Q. The Atlantic District eventually sold the former Campground near Harvey Station, NB. What happened to those funds?
- A. The Campground was sold for \$240,000.00, with proceeds disbursed as follows:

- Q. Since the launch of the fresh vision for our Bible College there has been approximately 140,000.00 committed. How much of that has come in?
- A. Approximately \$125,000.00 has come into our Campus Development Fund.
- Q. How much has the preliminary work cost? (Lawyers, Survey, expenses, culvert, etc)
- A. So far we have spent \$35,000.00
- Q. How much is in NCC's New Campus Development Fund at the present time?
- A. \$140,000.00 is currently in this fund for the first phase of our new campus on River Street in Fredericton.



The Plan

On June 06, 2007 – the first service of the 2007 Canadian Conference the Atlantic District of the United Pentecostal Church International held the ground breaking service for a new campus for NCC.

This past week machinery moved onto the site to begin the ground work. Topsoil has been removed and the foundation site excavated. Engineering plans are being finalized and will be delivered this coming week.

We've been at our McGloin Street Campus for over a half century and it has served us well, but our options for expansion in that location

have always been severely limited. Early in 2004, five acres of land on River Street was donated to the college by Capital Community Church. Located less than a mile from our present facilities, the new site will allow us to conveniently utilize our present campus



until we have our new buildings ready. We have already been able to pay for the extension of water and sewer services to the new property through a cooperative agreement with the City of Fredericton and two other nonprofit groups, using funds already in our *New Campus Development Fund*.

This past spring, our ministers have reaffirmed to build NCC's new campus in three stages beginning with an Administration and Education Building. As the college continues to grow and funding becomes available this phase will be followed by a Student Residence building, dining room and activity center. When completed NCC will have a state of the art facility to train our young people.

The Need

It will cost between \$800,000.00 to \$1,000,000.00 to construct the Administration and Education Building which is the first phase. This is a huge financial undertaking that cannot be shouldered by the college alone. The Atlantic District has \$140,000.00 for this project in our *Campus Development Fund*, and the pastors and church congregations in our district have pledged their financial cooperation.

Plans are well underway to provide funding. However, all of these plans are contingent upon individuals like you, who see this significant need and respond with generosity.



The building of a new Bible College is the single largest financial commitment the Atlantic District has ever assumed. But Northeast Christian College is also the single most effective evangelistic tool the Atlantic District has ever produced.

Dozens of pastors, missionaries, leaders and gospel workers trained at NCC have multiplied our past investments of prayer and finance into a harvest of thousands of souls.

The leadership and ministers of our district feel that now is the right time to enlarge our potential for revival and evangelism in Canada and around the world. We are depending on your continued commitment to make our vision for Northeast Christian College a reality.

The Opportunity

Because we know you believe in Northeast Christian College, we are asking you to make an investment in our future.

All of the funds raised will be invested in our new campus. Your gift will go directly to construct our Administration and Education building now in the beginning stage of construction.

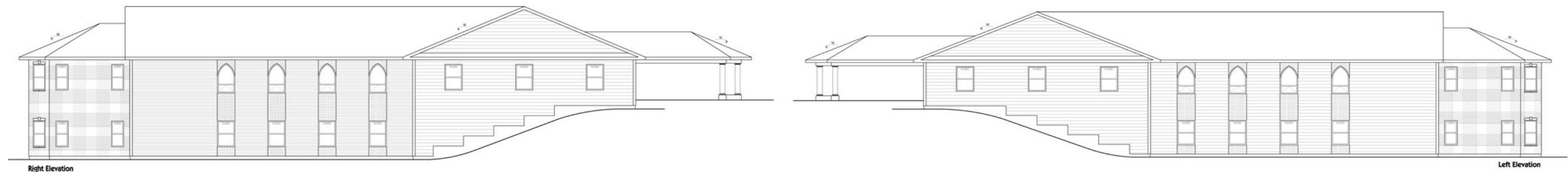
We believe that everyone should have an opportunity to give, so we've created as many options as possible for Summer Summit 2007. Here are some of the ways you can make a donation:
